Gooch & Burum contribute to same politicians



Assistance Authorization Act of 2007.




Burum owns a nonprofit

The nonprofit also pays Gooch

Public lobbying records confirmed that **Lesli Gooch** was also a registered lobbyist for CORE. CORE spent over \$400,000 to hire Gooch and her team in Washington, D.C., to advocate for a number of bills, including **H.R.** 4051.



Section 6 of H.R. 4051 authorized the government to give a grant to the National Community Renaissance Program.

The bill authorized \$5,000,000 for fiscal year 2008 and \$10,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2009 and 2010, for a total of \$25,000,000.




