

- Support for Headline Notions (Q6): The application of Matt Stoller's notions—such as "Control Data-Force Others to Price Based on Info How Powerful Operate

**Economy"**—to the manufactured housing industry is **supported in the body** of the report. The body cites evidence of:

- 1. **Consolidation:** The shift away from "mom-and-pop MHCs" toward institutional investment, as corroborated by Northmarq research.


# Disputes and Reputation (Q3, Q4)

This process is explicitly termed the "FEA model" and involves submitting drafts to multiple AI tools (Gemini, Copilot, Grok) for verification, with the final published article being a faithful reflection of the AI-verified draft's key claims and sourcing.



Mostly, with one title check noted. Matt Stoller's concepts on concentrated power are accurately MHI or Matt Stoller Items applied. MHI news from October 2025 regarding an annual meeting and recognition of award winners is supported by the MHI website (Result 2.2). 
