
The Time has Come for Action Over Posturing and Words SNAP, MHARR and Housing Crisis House-Senate Must Act

House-Senate Called to Fix SNAP Funding, Get Fed Employees Paid-MHARR Calls on Congress-Trump Admin and MHI to Fix ROAD to Housing Act

Last night (10.30.2025) President Donald J. Trump called on Congress to 'nuke' the Senate filibuster rule to get the federal government fully operating to programs like SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) funded and all federal employees paid. Several Democrats have said that they are using the lack of funding for the government, obviously including the SNAP food program, as a point of 'leverage.' Senate Republicans have voted over a dozen times to pass a clean continuing resolution (CR) that would allow for negotiations on programs like the costly Obamacare (the so-called Affordable Care Act (ACA) that even left-leaning Washington Post has said has never been affordable) program that Democrats cite as a reason to hold the federal budget - and thus the needy - hostage. The Democratic politics behind that plan may be backfiring on them, per left-leaning CNN and others. Private charities are stepping up hoping to fill the gap caused by the pending lapse of funding for SNAP.

One way or another, the Democratic "Schumer Shutdown" will end. Republicans in the U.S. House did their jobs, and Senate Republicans - including a few Democrats - have voted to fully open the government via funding through a so-called "clean CR."

When that happens does, the House will come back into session. That is when movement of some kind is expected on the ROAD to Housing Act 2025 that was passed by the Senate and attached to the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA).

The Washington, D.C. based <u>Manufactured Housing Association for Regulatory</u> (MHARR) reform is on record having asked Congress to amend the ROAD to Housing Act 2025.
